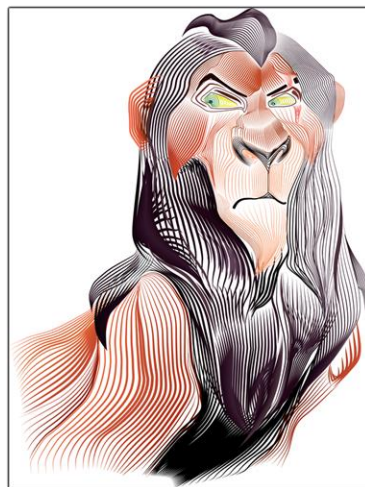

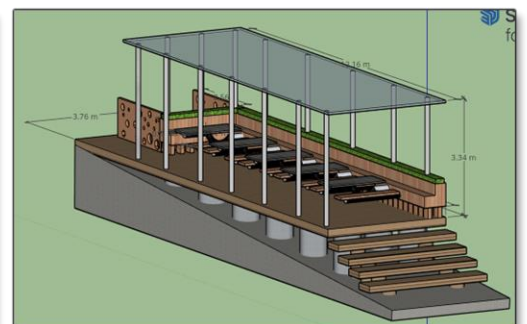
## Digital Media 11/12 - Line Art

# Accessibility Committee, Accessibility Plan & Accessibility Survey
