## Parking for Student Pick-up

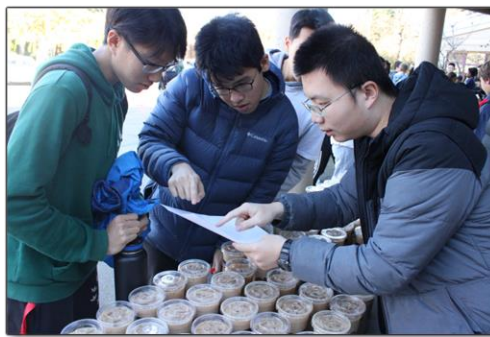

The LFMSS Student Council is sponsoring Giving Trees again this year.

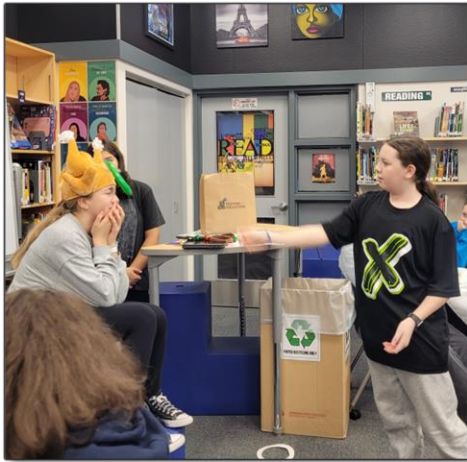


